## The 2022 Australia Day Community Events Grants program

To show its ongoing support for their work, the National Australia Day Council is providing up to \$7.5 million in grants to eligible councils and community organisations to host events on Australia Day 2022.

Australia Day event hosts can apply for up to \$20,000 to deliver events that use the National Australia Day Council's 'Reflect. Respect. Celebrate. We're all part of the story.' branding.

Applicants that collaborate with local Aboriginal and Torres Strait Islander communities to incorporate activities that reflect and respect the history of local indigenous people and celebrate their culture will be eligible to apply for an additional \$10,000.

In 2021, the National Australia Day Council provided 416 grants totalling more than \$7 million, allowing Australians in every state and territory to get together and reflect, respect and celebrate.
