

Who Can Apply?





Australian local government entities



Australian state or territory government entities



Australian not-for-profit organisations

- active ABN, bank account and public liability insurance of not less than \$10 million
- no overdue acquittals from previous rounds
- planned event should include an inclusivity element for people with disability
- one application per organisation

Successful applicants are required to use the Australia Day Designs and logo to promote the theme "Reflect. Respect. Celebrate"

Use of Grant Funds



What we will fund

- promotions & communications: invitations, ads, social media, branded items
- artist & talent fees: musicians, MCs, cultural performers
- accessibility measures: ramps, Auslan, live captioning, quiet zones
- event operations: venue hire, equipment rental, catering, security
- photography/videography: up to \$1,000 for professional capture
- virtual & digital content: live-streaming, online components, pre-recorded

What we won't fund

- organisation's core operational expense costs
- purchase of assets or infrastructure (e.g., buildings, renovations, BBQs, facility upgrades)
- costs not clearly attributable to Australia Day 2026
- events by local, state or territory gov's with lower investment than 2025
- non-Australia Day focused events

- Australia Day Multicultural Festival
- Australia Day Concert
- Australia Day Picnic
- Smoking Ceremony / Welcome to Country/Acknowledgement
- Australia Day Flag Raising Ceremony
- Australia Day Citizenship Ceremony
- Interactive youth workshops and youth-focused games
- Barbecue in the Park / Street

- Light/drone shows
- Australia Day Parade
- Aussie Beach Party
- Australia Day Breakfast / Lunch
- Cultural Ceremony
- Australia Day Race / Marathon
- Virtual event
- Digital content development for any of the above
- Australia Day event collateral (i.e. Australian symbols, banners, flags).

Submitting a Strong Application





1. Use the How-to-Apply guide

2. Link answers to the program objectives



3. Try to paint a clear picture (who, what, when, where, why)



4. Provide a balanced, itemised budget that matches your narrative

5. Build inclusion & accessibility into planning from the start





6. Upload all required docs early – ABN, insurance, bank statement

Mythbusters & FAQs



Myth: Only councils can apply.

Myth: Events must be on 26 Jan only.

Myth: Grants can cover staff wages or new infrastructure.

Myth:
Accessibility is
optional if
budget allows.

Myth: Late submissions may be considered.

Fact: NFPs and state / territory agencies are eligible too.

Fact: At least one activity must be on the day. Related events can run either side. Fact: Funding is for event-specific costs only. No salaries, capital works or office gear.

Fact: Inclusion and accessibility are mandatory assessed criteria.

Fact: The portal locks at midnight AEST on 8 Sep. no exceptions.
