

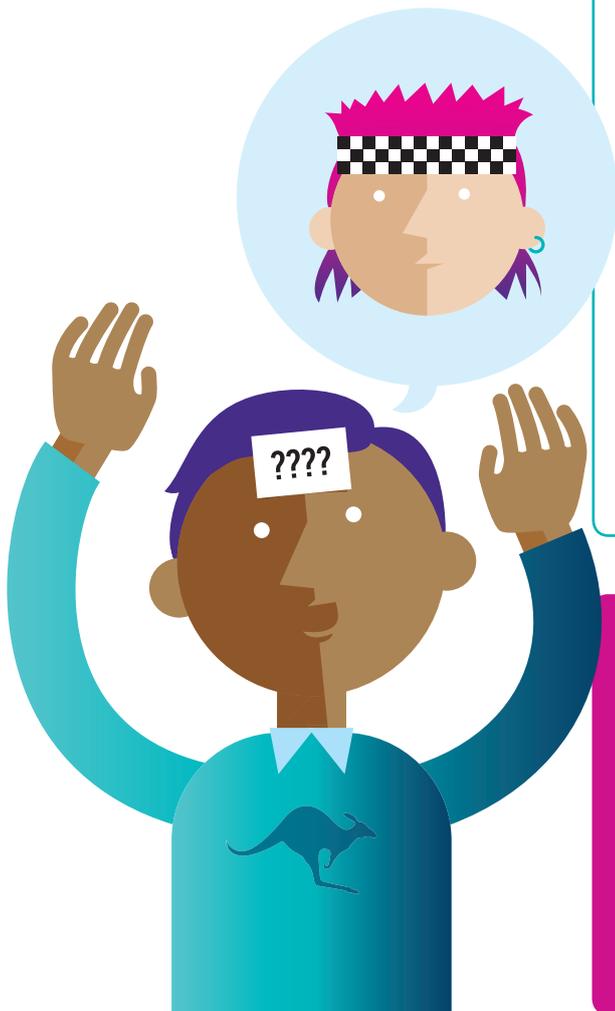
Aussie Celebrity Heads

What you need

- ▶ A celebrity name card for each player (provided on the following pages)
- ▶ Double sided tape, or similar, to stick the card to each player's forehead
- ▶ Prize (optional)

How to play

1. Players sit in a row facing the audience.
NB: It's important that players don't see the celebrity name written on the card stuck to their forehead. You might need to appoint a Game Master to ensure everything runs smoothly.
2. The starting player asks the entire audience/ other players any question that gives a 'yes' or 'no' answer. For example: Am I a famous sports player? The aim is to receive a 'yes' answer in order to ask more questions.
NB: Audience members answering the question must limit their response by answering either 'yes' or 'no' or 'too difficult/unknown.'
3. If the answer is:
 - ▶ Yes – player asks another question
 - ▶ No – player's turn is over and play rotates to the left
 - ▶ Too difficult/unknown – player asks another question
4. The first player to correctly guess their celebrity name wins the game. If a player takes a guess and it's incorrect, the player's turn is over and play rotates to the left.



Customise the game

In addition to the 36 celebrity cards provided, 18 blank cards are included so you can create additional celebrity names or develop your own unique names, for example:

- ▶ Friends, co-workers and family members
- ▶ Type of sports
- ▶ Items you might find at an Australia Day party!
